Cathedral Calling

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Message by Parish Priest



My Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, Jesus is confronted by the Saducees who did not believe in any resurrection or on-going life after death. Furthermore, they assumed that the eternal life that Jesus taught must be just like the life we have here. Hence, the absurd question about

marriage and progeny. Pope Francis during one of his general audiences, few years back, in the context of Sadducees question to Jesus on resurrection said ".....therefore, what will happen is quite the opposite of what the Sadducees expected. It is not this life that will serve as a reference point for eternity, for the other life that awaits us; rather, it is eternity - that life - which illumines and gives hope to the earthly life of each one of us! If we look at things from only a human perspective, we tend to say that man's journey moves from life to death. This is what we see! But this is only so if we look at things from a human perspective. Jesus turns this perspective upside down and states that our pilgrimage goes from death to life: the fullness of life! We are on a journey, on a pilgrimage toward the fullness of life, and that fullness of life is what illumines our journey! Therefore death stands behind us, not before us. Before us is the God of the living, the God of the covenant, the God who bears my name, our names stand before us, as he said: "I am the God of Abraham, of Isaac, of Jacob", and also the God with my name, with your name..., with our names. The God of the living! ... Before us stands the final defeat of sin and death, the beginning of a new time of joy and of endless light. But already on this earth, in prayer, in the Sacraments, in fraternity, we encounter Jesus and his love, and thus we may already taste something of the risen life. The experience we have of his love and his faithfulness ignites in our hearts like a fire and increases our faith in the resurrection. In fact, if God is faithful and loves, he cannot be thus for only a limited time: faithfulness is eternal, it cannot change. God's love is eternal, it cannot change! It is not only for a time: it is forever! It is for going forward! He is faithful forever and he is waiting for us, each one of us, he accompanies each one of us with his eternal faithfulness." So Brothers and Sisters, let us pray for ourselves to the Lord asking him to bless us with his eternal love today and forever. God Bless.

REFLECTION

The Sadducees want to know what Jesus thinks about the resurrection of the dead. They came to Jesus with what they thought was a case that would make the doctrine of the resurrection look very ridiculous. They thought that we would come forth again from the grave in the very same bodies which we now have, with all our needs and instincts. Our Lord corrected that erroneous idea. We shall all rise to a new and eternal life, in a form and an existence very different from that of our present life. Thus, the question of ownership of wives or property will not, and cannot, arise in our new life. He gave us a brief but basic description of what our risen bodies will be. It is sure that most of us would love to know a lot more about what our future state will be like. But if we knew all, then where would our faith and trust in God come in? In his brief answer to the Sadducees, Christ gives us the essential facts concerning our future status. First, he affirms that all those who have proved themselves worthy while in this life will rise to an eternal life. In that life we will become like angels. Second, our Lord clearly affirmed that those raised from the dead are no longer liable to death. Many Christians, even good, pious Christians, fear death and try to keep the very thought of it far from their minds. This is very understandable for those who believe that death is the end. To a certain degree it is understandable in the case of the believer or the Christian, whose conscience is not at peace with God. We can come out from such fear by removing our sins, and by putting ourselves right with God. The normal, pious Christian should see death as what it is, an end of his time of probation and the door to his eternal reward. Therefore, no Christian should be afraid of it. Of course, part of the fears which death instils come from the fear of the judgment which accompanies it. If we think every now and then, that our death is around the comer, we will turn to the God of mercy, to our loving Father, and ask for His forgiveness. He never refuses pardon to those who with a sincere heart, ask for it.

Let each one of us look into our own conscience today. Let us ask ourselves, how we would fare if death should claim us tonight. If there are sins on my conscience, which I would not want there when facing my just Judge, I still have time to approach the merciful Father. The Christian who does this daily, or even weekly, will not worry when death calls. He can rest assured that it is the beginning of the true and everlasting life, planned for him by God before time began.
